

Flowchart of what Happens to Albertan Women who Screen over 5 Years (pg 1) and do not Screen over 5 Years (pg 2)



*Note, there will be a small number of women who die before 5 years of diagnosis of reasons other than cancer, they will not be captured here for simplicity

Definitions

100 Women:

- Same demographics as those who screen i.e. 5 year time period (2007-2011);
- Only women who did NOT screen during the time period;
- Have to be Albertans from 2007 onwards;
- Age 50-69 (age calculated at the middle year of 5-year period Jul/01/2009);
- Using 5 year survival.
- *Count only women either alive throughout the 5 years or deceased due to breast cancer. i.e. did not die from another cause.

2 have breast cancer:

• Diagnosed with breast cancer during or within 2 years of the reference dates i.e. 2007-2013

98 do not have breast cancer:

• Not diagnosed with breast cancer during or within 2 years of the reference dates i.e. 2007-2013

~3 in 17 (0.4/2) treated but do not survive:

• Of those diagnosed, anyone deceased of breast cancer within the 5 years post diagnosis

~14 in 17 (1.6/2) treated and live:

• Of those diagnosed, anyone still alive after 5 years post diagnosis

^{*}Note: there will be a small number of women diagnosed with cancer but then die of another cause, they will not be displayed for simplicity.
