Where can I learn about breast cancer screening?

❖ If you haven't had a mammogram in the last 2 years, please think about making an appointment soon.


Where can I have my free screening mammogram?

Please call your local radiology clinic directly to book an appointment. To find a radiology clinic near you, see the list of clinics that came with this letter. You can also go to www.screeningforlife.ca and click Breast Cancer Screening, then How to Book a Mammogram.

Note: Some radiology clinics may need a healthcare provider's name to book a mammogram. This is so they know where to send the results and who will follow-up, if needed.

Remember, **mammograms don't find all breast cancer**. Know what looks and feels normal for you and see your healthcare provider right away if you notice changes to your breasts.
